WELCOME TO THE HIGH KNOB REGION

The High Knob Region is named for High Knob, the highest point in the Cumberland Mountains. The 4,200-foot High Knob summit is part of Stone Mountain which, at 13 miles wide and 26 miles long, connects many of the communities and recreation sites in the High Knob Region. This region includes nine Southwest Virginia communities in Wise, Scott, and Lee counties and the City of Norton.

Home to three state parks, the more than 90,000-acre Clinch Ranger District on the Jefferson National Forest, and other community parks and trails, the region boasts a variety of outdoor adventures.

The High Knob Region is also part of a global epicenter for biological diversity in the Central Appalachians, with a variety of wildlife and plant species calling the region home.

This visitor guide offers information about the region's communities, outdoor recreation sites, attractions, landmarks, signature events, amenities, and more.





HIGH KNOB REGION COMMUNITIES





The City of Norton is the smallest incorporated city in Virginia.

Nestled beneath High Knob - the highest point in the Cumberland Mountains - Norton is centrally located between two main highways - U.S. 23 and U.S. Route 58 Alternate - and near the crossroads of Virginia, Kentucky, and Tennessee.

The city's Flag Rock Recreation Area is three miles above downtown Norton. The thousand-acre park's outdoor recreation includes fishing, hiking, mountain biking, and rock climbing. Norton's Upper Reservoir is a state-stocked fishery and its Flag Rock Area Trails system is open to mountain biking and foot traffic. At 3,250 feet in elevation, Flag Rock Overlook affords views of downtown Norton and surrounding mountains. The park also connects to the Jefferson National Forest.

Downtown Norton offers a variety of restaurants and shops and is within a few miles of Country Cabin II, a Crooked Road venue, and the Central Drive-In Movie Theatre.

Lee County is the western-most county in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The county was formed in 1792 from Russell County and is named in honor of Henry Light-Horse Harry Lee, an American Revolutionary War officer and the governor of Virginia at the time Lee County was formed. The county borders two states, Tennessee and Kentucky, and has three incorporated towns: Pennington Gap, St. Charles, and Jonesville.


The county is home to several outdoor and cultural attractions, including Cumberland Gap National Historical Park, Wilderness Road State Park, hiking trails leading to the popular Sand Cave and White Rocks landmarks, and the Powell River.

The town of Pennington Gap also has the Lee Theatre, which offers a variety of entertainment, including live music, plays, and more, throughout the year.









Scott County is a natural for music lovers, history buffs, nature enthusiasts and vacationers of all types.

Visitors can learn about the important role the Wilderness Road played in America's westward expansion at the Daniel Boone Wilderness Trail Interpretive Center and explore the area's railroad history at Fannon Railroad Museum and Natural Tunnel State Park.

The famed Carter family, pioneers in bringing national recognition to country music, are also from Scott County. The Carter Fold, a music venue on the Carters' homeplace in Hiltons, has weekly old-time country and folk music concerts and a museum highlighting the Carter Family.


The Clinch River and Jefferson National Forest also run through Scott County. Highlights include Little Stony Falls and Little Stony National Recreation Trail, Devil's Fork Trail and Devil's Bathtub, and Bark Camp Recreation Area and Lake.

Wise County offers natural beauty, outdoor recreation opportunities, a vibrant music and artisan scene, and abundant southern hospitality.

The county is home to six towns: Appalachia, Big Stone Gap, Coeburn Pound, St. Paul, and Wise.

The Jefferson National Forest also runs through Wise County. Highlights include the High Knob Observation Tower, High Knob Recreation Area, Chief Benge Scout Trail, and Guest River Gorge Trail.

The High Knob Region has a rich cultural history, and several museums and music venues in Wise County celebrate this heritage.

WEEKEND GETAWAYS

HIGH ELEVATION FUN

Explore the City of Norton's Flag Rock Recreation Area. Visit www.explorenortonva.com for details about the below sites.

Visit Flag Rock Overlook. Enjoy views of Norton and beyond from a rock outcrop that sits at an elevation of 3,250 feet. Snap a photo of the famous Woodbooger statue as you walk the gravel path to the overlook.

Get your heart pumping. Explore the Flag Rock Area Trails system (open to mountain biking and foot travel) and check out climbing routes at the Labyrinth and Sanctuary.

Fish the city's Upper and Lower Reservoirs. The Upper Reservoir is a state-stocked trout fishery that is also open to paddling and electric motor boats.

Head into downtown Norton for lunch. See High Knob Visitor Resources Page 43 for more information.

HIGH KNOB WEEKEND GETAWAYS

HIGH ELEVATION FUN

Explore High Knob Tower and Jefferson National Forest.

Visit High Knob Observation Tower. Located atop the 4,200foot High Knob summit, enjoy views of distant peaks as far away as Great Smoky Mountains National Park and West Virginia.

Hike to High Knob Recreation Area. A one-mile trail (also the start of the Chief Benge Scout Trail) travels from the High Knob Observation Tower parking lot to this U.S. Forest Service site. See Page 65 for more details.

HIGH KNOB SUNSETS

Visit these overlooks for exceptional sunsets. See Page 69 for more information and directions to each site.

POWELL VALLEY OVERLOOK

Located on U.S. 23 North between Big Stone Gap and Norton, enjoy views of the valley between Powell and Little Stone Mountains.

HIGH KNOB OBSERVATION TOWER

Five states are visible on a clear day from the tower, which rests atop the 4,200-foot High Knob summit.

FLAG ROCK OVERLOOK

Resting at 3,250 feet in elevation, the overlook's rocky outcrop offers views of Downtown Norton, the neighboring Town of Wise, and into Kentucky.

LAKES & RIVERS

The High Knob Region has numerous lakes, rivers, and streams to paddle, fish, and hike along. See below highlights and page 67 for more sites.

TAKE A HIKE

A 3.7-mile (round-trip) trail open to hiking and mountain biking circles Bark Camp Lake in Bark Camp Recreation Area. This trail, located in Scott County, is on the Jefferson National Forest and is maintained by the U.S. Forest Service's Clinch Ranger District. *https://www.fs.usda.gov/gwj*

GO FISH

The 45-acre Bark Camp Lake is stocked and maintained by Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources. The lake offers a variety of fish species including largemouth bass, black crappie, several sunfish species, channel catfish, and trout. https://dwr.virginia.gov/waterbody/bark-camp-lake/


ENJOY A SCENIC DRIVE

Travel the Thomas Jefferson Scenic Byway Loop, a 40+ mile driving route that passes several of the region's recreation sites, scenic vistas, and trails. See www.explorenortonva.com and Pages 5-6 of this guide for the route. Note: Some gravel roads on this route might not be suitable for all vehicles. Some roads might also be impassable or closed during winter months. *Please contact the U.S. Forest Service, (276) 679-8370, for details on Forest Road closures and conditions.*

VISIT THE GUEST RIVER GORGE

Explore the 5.5-mile Guest River Gorge Trail. This crushed gravel path travels along the Guest River to its confluence with the Clinch River. Gentle grades accompany the footpath, which is characterized by giant sandstone cliffs that tower above the trail and bring the sound of the Guest River to a thunderous roar. CLINCH RIVER

Float the Clinch River. The Clinch River travels through Virginia from Tazewell County to the Tennessee state line. The river runs through the Town of St. Paul, which has river access and outfitters to aid your explorations.

Check out Clinch Life Outfitters, Clinch River Life, and Clinch River Adventures. All offer rentals and/or guided trips on the Clinch River. See Page 79 for contact information.

Visit Clinch River State Park. The park's St. Paul unit is open and has nine miles of trails. https://www.dcr.virginia.gov/state-parks/clinch-river

GATHERING IN THE GAP MUSIC FESTIVAL

Held each May in Big Stone Gap, this festival celebrates the traditions of old-time, bluegrass, blues, and Americana music in the Appalachian region. *www.gatheringinthegap.org*

DR. RALPH STANLEY HILLS OF HOME FESTIVAL

Held near Coeburn each May, this festival was started by the late Dr. Ralph Stanley and highlights old-time bluegrass music. *www.drralphstanleyfestival.com*

CLINCH RIVER DAYS

This annual festival is held in early June in the town of St. Paul and celebrates mountain heritage and the Clinch River. *www.clinchriverfest.com*

HIGH KNOB Spring Flings



EXPLORE A RAIL-TRAIL

Two former railbeds transformed into trails offer beautiful spring views. The Guest River Gorge Trail in Coeburn is 5.5 miles and travels along the Guest River to its confluence with the Clinch River. The Powell River Trail in Appalachia is a 1.7-mile (one-way) paved trail that travels along the Powell River on the abandoned L&N Railroad line. Finally, while not a rail-trail, the Cranesnest Trail is a 3.5-mile (one-way) gravel path parallelling the Cranesnest River in Dickenson County. See Page 65 for more details.

GO RUN

Three spring races showcase High Knob's natural wonders and communities. In April, the towns of Big Stone Gap and Appalachia host the Union Half Marathon, which travels through both towns, including Big Stone Gap's scenic Greenbelt and Appalachia's Powell River Trail. Also in April, Natural Tunnel State Park, near Duffield, hosts Run The Tunnel, a 3.8-mile road/trail run. In May, Norton hosts the Fit Farmer 12K Trail Run on the Flag Rock Area Trails system. *See Pages 51-56 for more details.*

GO FISH

NORTON RESERVOIR

9.8-acres. State-stocked trout water. Stocking occurs annually between Oct. 1 and May 15. A Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR) trout license is required Oct. 1-June 15.

BIG STONY CREEK

Special regulation trout water. Catch-and-release. Includes portion of Big Stony Creek (Mountain Fork) and its tributaries on the Jefferson National Forest from the High Knob Lake outlet downstream to the confluence of Chimney Rock Fork and Big Stony Creek.

CLEAR CREEK

Stocked with rainbow trout three times a year between Oct. 1-April 30. A DWR trout license is required between Oct. 1-June 15. National Forest Permit is also required.

SUMMER ESCAPES

LET'S GET FESTIVE

The High Knob Region boasts several summer festivals. Norton's Best Friend Festival, held in June, is a weeklong celebration packed with festivities for the whole family. The High Knob Music Festival, a daylong music festival in High Knob Recreation Area, and the Virginia Kentucky District Fair, a more than 100-year old festival in Wise County, are also held in June. Fans of barbecue should check out the annual Chillin' and Grillin' In The Glades barbecue contest in downtown Wise in July. If searching for outdoor adventures, check out the High Knob Outdoor Fest in downtown Norton in August. Closing out the summer are two festivals celebrating two High Knob communities: Appalachia's Coal Railroad Days in August and Coeburn's Guest River Rally over Labor Day weekend. ENJOY A PICNIC

Beat the heat with a high elevation picnic at Flag Rock Recreation Area or High Knob Recreation Area. Consider turning your picnic into a campout. Both recreation areas have campgrounds. Flag Rock Campground is typically open April-October. The High Knob Recreation Area campground opens in late May and closes in late September.

FALL FAVES

LET'S GET FESTIVE

The Clinch Coalition holds its annual High Knob Naturalist Rally in late September, offering educational experiences to explore the natural world of High Knob. Norton's Woodbooger Fest, held in October in Flag Rock Recreation Area, celebrates the Woodbooger, a mythical Bigfoot-like creature. Three other October festivals that celebrate the region's cultural offerings include the Wise County Famous Fall Fling in Wise, Blue Highway Fest in Big Stone Gap, and Home Craft Days at Mountain Empire Community College in Big Stone Gap. *See Page 55 for details.*

GO RUN

Five fall running races showcase the High Knob Region's natural wonders and communities. The City of Norton hosts the Mountain Fork Half Marathon in September followed by the High Knob Hellbender 10K in early October. Both races are part of the High Knob Triple Crown running series, which also includes the Fit Farmer 12K Trail Run in May. Also in October is the Cloudsplitter 100, an ultra-distance running race on High Knob. Two shorter road races include the Heart One Cardiac Rehab 5K during the Wise County Famous Fall Fling and the Lincoln Road Turkey Day 5K on Thanksgiving Day in downtown Norton. *See Page 55 for details.*


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LEAF PEEPING

Drive the Thomas Jefferson Scenic Byway Loop. Stop by Flag Rock Overlook and High Knob Observation Tower for high elevation fall foliage views. Take a hike on the Flag Rock Area Trails system or Chief Benge Scout Trail for close-ups of the changing leaves. GET LOST

CATCH A SHOW

Check out a Crooked Road music venue. Country Cabin II in Norton is the descendent of the Country Cabin, a small oneroom log and stone structure that was built in 1937-38 with the encouragement of local ballad singer and songwriter Kate O'Neil Peters Sturgill. Built in 2002, Country Cabin II sits across the road from its predecessor and hosts Saturday night concerts in addition to other events. Lays Hardware, located in Coeburn, is a former hardware store that hosts jam sessions every Thursday and bluegrass performances every Friday. Carter Fold, located in Scott County, celebrates the Carter family and has weekly Saturday night concerts. The property also has a museum with information about the Carter family and bluegrass music. *See Page 48 for more details about each venue*.


TAKE THE PLUNGE

HIGH KNOB WINTER WONDERS



TAKE A HIKE

Higher elevation hikes might not be as accessible during the winter months, but there are several lower elevation winter walks in the High Knob Region. See below suggestions and Page 65 for more information.

LEGION PARK TRAIL

1.4-miles (one-way). Trail climbs 800+ feet from Legion Park into Norton's Flag Rock Recreation Area. Part of the Flag Rock Area Trails system.

POWELL RIVER TRAIL

3.4 miles (round-trip). Paved rail-trail follows the Powell River. Highlights include two former trestles and two tunnels.

GREENBELT TRAIL

2.8 miles. Paved trail follows the Powell River and loops downtown Big Stone Gap.

CAMPUS TRAIL SYSTEM

(University of Virginia's College at Wise) The college has several short trails on its campus.

GUEST RIVER GORGE TRAIL

5.5 miles (one-way). Rail-trail follows the Guest River through a deep gorge to its confluence with the Clinch River.

SUGAR HILL LOOP TRAIL

3.3-mile loop. Hike is in Clinch River State Park's St. Paul unit. Enjoy spectacular views as you walk through wooded areas, open fields, and along the Clinch River.

NATURAL TUNNEL STATE PARK

The park, located in Scott County, has seven hiking trails highlighting the park's unique features.

LAKE KEOKEE LOOP

3.7-mile loop. This Lee County trail circles the 92-acre Keokee Lake.

BARK CAMP LAKESHORE TRAIL

3.7-mile loop. The trail circles Bark Camp Lake in Bark Camp Recreation Area.

CRANESNEST TRAIL

3.5 miles (one-way). Gravel multi-use trail in Dickenson County.

WILDLIFE VIEWING

The High Knob Region is part of a global epicenter for biological diversity in the Central Appalachians. A variety of plant and wildlife species call the region home, including some found exclusively here. See descriptions of the Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources' Bird and Wildlife Trail loops below. Visit www.dwr.virginia.gov/vbwt for more information.

APPALACHIAN WONDERS

This loop offers ample opportunities to view a variety of bird species, flora, salamanders, insects, and mammals. Sites on the loop include the University of Virginia's College at Wise, Bear Creek (Wise) Reservoir, Guest River Gorge Trail, Little Stony National Recreation Trail, Bark Camp Lake, Glady Fork Wetland, High Knob Recreation Area, and Legion Park.

BIG STONE GAP LOOP

Several sites are within walking distance of downtown. Sites include Fraley Park, Southwest Virginia Museum State Park, Bullitt Park/Greenbelt Trail, Roaring Branch, and Keokee Lake.

DANIEL BOONE LOOP

Sites on this loop comprise the most western section of the Virginia Bird and Wildlife Trail. Some stops on the loop include Natural Tunnel State Park, Daniel Boone Trail, Wilderness Road State Park and Cumberland Gap National Historical Park.

LONESOME PINE LOOP

Many sites on this loop are located on the Pound River or along waterways that join the Pound River. Some stops on the loop include Breaks Interstate Park, John W. Flannagan Reservoir, Birch Knob, Cranesnest Trail, and North Fork of the Pound.

SAINT PAUL LOOP

Several rare and endangered species live along this loop, including the Eastern Hellbender. Some sites include Oxbow Lake Park, Sugar Hill Loop Trail, Wetlands Estonoa, and A.R. Matthews Memorial Park.
